

Arkansas Library Association Executive Board Meeting Friday, September 27, 2019, 4:00 PM Hot Springs Embassy Suites, Hot Springs, AR

- I. Call to Order President Jil'Lana Heard called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.
- II. Roll Call & Minutes The attendance sign in sheet was circulated for this meeting. Philip Shackelford motioned to accept minutes from the last meeting, July 26, 2019, and Carol Coffey seconded it.
- **III. Budget** Lynn Valetutti announced that there is \$117,705.41 in the checking account, \$7,000 of which is to be paid toward the conference.
- **IV. ALA Councilor's Report** Lacy Wolfe is registered for ALA Mid-Winter in Philadelphia. She is arranging a dinner for attendees to solicit feedback about proposed ALA organizational changes, which were outlined in more detail later in the meeting and are available in the Dropbox.

VI. Business Items

- a. Cancelled Sessions Crystal Gates announced tomorrow's 10:30 a.m. 3D Content in Libraries and The Magic of Multisensory Approaches to Language! sessions have been cancelled. Sched is the best way to keep up with information about the ArLA SELA Conference. Thirty-one people attended the Preconference.
- b. ALA Booth & Wanda Brown interviews Lacy Wolfe asked people to stop by the ALA booth and take swag. She is arranging interviews for people to share the impact ALA has made on them with Wanda Brown, but the times are not firm yet.
- c. SCOE Slides from the ALA Steering Committee on Organizational Effectiveness are available in the Dropbox. SCOE recommends a top-down restructure and asserts to reorganize a modern association for modern times. The plan is to present the final version during ALA Mid-Winter and vote at the Annual Conference in Chicago. She read a letter from several round tables lamenting the proposal as going backward in ALA's democratic structure. The plan calls for a 17-member executive board with 12 elected positions and doing away with the council and several committees. The policy development committee would be appointed by the executive committee. Crystal Gates said most state chapters are also against the move because we would have no representation.
- d. 2020 Conference After a site visit, by Judy Calhoun, John McGraw, and Philip Shackelford, Philip submitted a proposed contract for the next ArLA Conference at the Fort Smith Convention Center and Double Tree Hotel from October 16 18, 2020. Other dates are available. The cost for liability insurance was discussed. Philip said Larry Cooper, of the Double Tree, who is also over the Rogers Embassy Suites, agreed to lower the cost for the 2022 conference if both were booked. The cost would be \$8,000 for 2020 and \$6,000 for 2022. Room rates were set at \$109 with breakfast. There was a \$40 to \$1 comp rate, as compared to the \$50 to \$1 rate this year. There is a catering list since neither provide catering. AV costs would be minimal because screens and a few projectors are included, and other items may possibly be borrowed from local libraries and the State Library. The WiFi is free. The committee is looking into the possibility of combining this conference with Missouri or Oklahoma. Britt Anne Murphy moved and Lynn Valetutti seconded to accept the contracts pending amendments for holding the October 16 18, 2020, ArLA Conference at the Ft. Smith Convention Center and Doubletree Hotel. The motion passed.

- **VIII. Adjournment** Philip Shackelford made a motion to end the meeting, and Autumn Mortenson seconded it.
