SELA Representative--Ellen Johnson: Goals for 2006: Continue to provide news/information to the Ark. Library Association & SELA; encourage membership in SELA; attend/participate in the TLA/SELA joint conference April 5-7, 2006 in Memphis

Accomplishments for 2005: Provided news of the Ark. Library Association to <u>The Southeastern Librarian</u> and to the board and membership of SELA. Provided news of the Southeastern Library Association to the Ark. Library Association's board and journal and listserv. Participated in the SELA Leadership Conference held in May 2005, in Decatur, GA.

Constitution Committee--Barbie James: Accomplishments for 2005: Revisions have been made to bring the constitution and bylaws up-to-date with changes that had been voted on at various times.

On-going projects: More revisions will need to be made since we have changed our management firm. We will work with Barbara to complete the updating process.

Finance Committee--Jamie Melson/Barbara Martin: Balance as of Oct. 1, 2005 is \$44,410.00 compared to this time last year which was \$22,030.00

Intellectual Freedom Committee--Kevin Barron: no report.

Legislative Committee--Dave Burdick: 2005 was a good year legislatively. One of our main goals for the 2005 legislative session was to restore State Funding for the Public Libraries. The committee worked closely with the Advocates for Arkansas Public Libraries group, who hired Martha Perry to monitor Library related issues, and to work closely with the legislature to support good issues, and oppose bad issues. The results show that Public Library funding, although not up to the \$4.9 million we had 5 years ago, rose to \$3 million for this year, and \$4 million for next year. Libraries also scored big with the acquiring general improvement funds, although much of this is currently held up in the courts. We also stopped a few issues, such as another attempt to abolish the MLS requirement for Public Library Directors. We also saw some positive changes which allow Public Libraries easier access to the dedicated funds held by the city or county governments.

The Legislative Committee recognized the needs of other Libraries, especially those in Higher Education, and K-12 Education. College and Universities were under the budget knife too, but came out of the legislative session fairly well. Public Schools wanted, and needed, more

money, but at least they did not see any cuts. For both of these organizations, it was more of a status quo situation by the end of the session.

On the national level, Libraries scored a big victory in knocking a large hole into the antiprivacy issues of the Patriot Act in the federal courts. The House and Senate have been working on the Patriot Act re-authorization, and Libraries have been working closely on this issue to make positive changes to secure the privacy of our users.

Libraries also saw another increase in national funding, which is against the trend of many organizations which have seen cuts in their funding.

Scholarship Committee--Kaye Talley: Goals for 2006: To award a scholarship; to revise the scholarship policy; and to raise money for the scholarship. Accomplishments for 2005 were: a scholarship was presented to Regina Cortez, Librarian/Director of the Malvern - Hot Spring County Library and also the Mid-Arkansas Regional Librarian (which covers Hot Spring, Dallas, Cleveland, and Grant counties); preliminary work on policy revisions was done. Suggestions for 2006--budget: \$1,500 for the sholarship itself.
